From the Vicar's desk

I often sign off on an email or text with the word, 'Blessings' I prefer this to 'God bless' or 'yours in Jesus', etc. I use this word as I would like the recipient to receive something of God's blessing whatever the content of the email or text might be.

What does it mean to receive a blessing from God?

This year in Lent we are following a series of studies from Matthew 5: 1-12 known as The Beatitudes or, you might rename them, the road to blessing. On first inspection, these look like a set of impossible demands that we could never reach – such as 'blessed are the poor in Spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven'. I know many people who are poor in spirit and have no conception that they blessed. That is, until you turn the meaning around. The Kingdom of Heaven is Jesus himself, and the beatitudes are not a series of tests or expectations but rather a deeper understanding that we are blessed when we come to Jesus wanting a relationship with Him – it's our poverty of spirit that opens the door for this to happen. It's turning the expectations of the world upside down, it's a new radical way of thinking, and it's all undeserved – or unconditional – Grace.

So I hope you might be blessed as you consider what these Beatitudes mean for you – there are lots of ways to dig deeper into the eight blessings at CCB - the Lent and Easter leaflet explains them all so please join us on the road to blessings.

Time for a holistic renovation of Christ Church's buildings

The main church building is almost 120 years old and is showing signs of wear. Settlement of the ground has made the building lower than the surrounding areas, increasing risks of flooding. Water leakages in the exterior walls have led to weakening of the interior walls. The walls have been tilting, leading to growing cracks in the concrete – visible inside and outside the church.

As was shared during during the worship services on 9 March, the PCC has been working with experts within and outside the congregation to conduct detailed surveys of the church buildings and overall campus to assess existing conditions and damage, in order to prioritize repair needs.

The first step is to urgently fix rain gutter leakages and exterior cracks to minimize future water damage. We will simultaneously develop a longer-term renovation plan that will involve guidance from the Fine Arts Department of Thailand for technical and financial support.

We ask the congregation to please consider how we can be better stewards of our facilities so Christ Church can continue to be a "spiritual oasis" for generations to come. Meet Bob Gosling

I first came to Thailand in 1967 as a teacher under contract to the Thai Government. The fact that I obtained this contract straight after my graduate training year (a long story) was clear evidence to me that the Lord wanted me here. Also, coming here gave me the chance to marry the love of my life, Shara, whom I had met in the UK and who was then teaching at Thammasat University. We now have one daughter and a grand-daughter.



Over the years, as a Christian working mainly in education but later on as a media specialist for the US Government, I have endeavoured to serve the Lord as a "tent-maker" in the area of Bible teaching and preaching. My main ministry has been at the Asian Institute of Technology Fellowship, Rangsit, which I helped set up in the 1970s. The fellowship comprises students and staff from South East Asia and much further afield. I still minister there once a month. We had a 50-year anniversary last year and it was a joy to meet old friends from around the world.

Biblical Hebrew and Greek are of great interest to me. As a teenager in the UK, I was obliged to learn Greek at school. Our studies included reading a comedy by Aristophanes (we nicknamed him "Harry Stuffy-Knees"). The comedy, I have to say, was not a great source of laughs for us boys, but - surprise - after becoming a Christian, I realized how useful Greek is for Biblical studies, and I have continued to study it. I conducted two short courses in Greek and Hebrew for Christ Church members a year or so ago.
